Body Condition Score		1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9		<p>1 – emaciated – ribs, spine, pelvis and all bony prominences evident from a distance, no discernable fat, noticeable loss of muscle mass.</p> <p>2- very thin - ribs, spine, pelvis easily visible, no palpable fat, minimal loss of muscle mass.</p> <p>3 – thin – ribs easily palpated and sometimes visible, spine visible, no fat over the ribs, pelvis becoming prominent, obvious waist and abdominal tuck</p> <p>4 – underweight – ribs easily palpated with minimal fat covering, waist visible from above, evident abdominal tuck.</p> <p>5 – ideal – ribs palpable but not seen, waist seen from above, abdominal tuck seen from the side</p> <p>6 – overweight – ribs palpable through excess fat covering, waist not prominent from above, abdominal tuck seen from the side</p> <p>7 – heavy – ribs difficult to palpate, fat deposits at lumbar and base of tail, waist absent or barely visible, abdominal tuck may be absent</p> <p>8 – obese – ribs palpable only with very firm pressure, heavy fat deposits at lumbar and base of tail, no waist or abdominal tuck, may be pot bellied</p> <p>9 – grossly obese – large fat deposits over back neck and limbs, no waist or abdominal tuck, pot bellied.</p>
